The phrase ends with a descending Sonata G Major piano arpeggio in the triplet rhythm. Brahms here works much like Beethoven had before him: he introduces a germ out of which the themes for the whole movement eventually evolve and grow. It then works out this gesture as both it and the piano gradually build.

To emphasize the change here, Brahms writes *dolcissimo* extremely sweetly. In the B-minor and G-minor passages, the violin takes the triplet rhythm along with the piano Sonata G Major in the B-minor. It commences in D minor with a repetition of the foregoing link, followed by a variation on it which, taken first in the bass and then repeated in the treble, leads to the opening phrase of the first subject. The piano closely imitates these one beat later.

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
